

Governor orders Hoosiers to stay home in fight against COVID-19

Governor Eric J. Holcomb delivered a statewide address on Monday to order that Hoosiers remain in their homes except when they are at work or for permitted activities, such as taking care of others, obtaining necessary supplies, and for health and safety. The order is in effect from March 25 to April 7.

"The next two weeks are critical if we are to slow the spread of COVID-19, and we must slow the spread. You must be part of the solution, not the problem," Holcomb said.

The first positive case of COVID-19 in Indiana was reported on March 6. Since then the number of positive cases has increased on a near daily basis, escalating as the capacity to test has grown. As of Monday, the number of tests completed in Indiana is 1,960, the number of positive cases is 259 and seven deaths have been reported.

In all, Holcomb issued four executive orders:

- EO 20-08. Stay at Home. Provides for essential and nonessential business and operations, infrastructure, government services, travel and activities outside of one's home.
- EO 20-09. Continuity of State Operations. Provides for the continuing operation of state government through 8 a.m. April 7 with restricted access to government buildings and services.
- EO 20-10. Enforcement Directive Regarding Prohibition of In-Person Dining.
- EO 20-11. Provisions for carryout consumption of alcohol.

Indiana Stay-At-Home Order <u>Frequently Asked</u> <u>Questions</u>

When does the order take effect?

The Stay-At-Home Order takes effect Tuesday, March 24, at 11:59 p.m.

When does the order end?

The order ends on Monday, April 6, at 11:59 p.m., but could be extended if the outbreak warrants it.

Where does the order apply?

The Stay-At-Home Order applies to the entire state of Indiana. Unless you work for an essential business or are doing an essential activity, you must stay home.

Is this mandatory or a recommendation?

This order is mandatory. For the safety of all Hoosiers, people must stay home and prevent the spread of COVID-19.

How will this order be enforced?

Staying home is critical to reducing the spread of COVID-19 in your community. Adhering to the order will save lives, and it is the responsibility of every Hoosier to do their part. However, if the order is not followed, the Indiana State Police will work with local law enforcement to enforce this order. The Indiana State Department of Health and the Alcohol and Tobacco Commission will enforce the restaurant and bar restrictions. What is an essential business?

Essential businesses and services include but are not limited to grocery stores, pharmacies, gas stations, police stations, fire stations, hospitals, doctor's offices, health care facilities, garbage pickup, public transit and public service hotlines such as SNAP and HIP 2.0. A list can be found in the Governor's executive order at in.gov/coronavirus.

What is an essential activity?

Essential activities include but are not limited to activities for health and safety, necessary supplies and services, outdoor activity, certain types of essential work, and to take care of others.

I work for an essential business. Will I be allowed to travel to and from work?

Law enforcement will not be stopping drivers on their way to and from work, traveling for an essential activity such as going to the grocery store, or just taking a walk.

Will the grocery store/pharmacy be open?

Yes, grocery stores and pharmacies are essential services.

Can I still order take out/delivery from restaurants and bars?

Yes, restaurants and bars can continue to provide takeout and delivery, but should be closed to dine-in patrons.

What if I still have to go to work?

You should stay home unless your work is an essential function such as a health care provider, grocery store clerk or first responder. If you have been designated essential by your employer, you should continue to go to work and practice social distancing.

What if I think my business should be closed, but they're still asking me to report to work?

Essential businesses will remain open during the stayat-home order to provide services that are vital to the lives of Hoosiers. If you believe your business is nonessential but still are being asked to show up to work, you may discuss it with your employer.

A certain service is essential for me, but the governor didn't include it. What do I do?

The stay-at-home order was issued to protect the health, safety and well-being of Hoosiers. Although some businesses such as fitness centers and salons will be closed, essential services will always be available. For a list of essential businesses that will continue to operate during the order, visit in.gov/coronavirus.

Will roads in Indiana be closed?

No, the roads will remain open. You should only travel if it is for your health or essential work.

Can I still take a plane out of Indiana?

Planes and other types of transportation should be used for essential travel.

What if my home is not a safe environment?

If it is not safe for you to remain home, you are able and encouraged to find another safe place to stay during this order. Please reach out so someone can help. You can call the domestic violence hotline at 1-800-799-SAFE or your local law enforcement.

What about homeless people who cannot stay at home?

The administration wants to protect the health and safety of all Hoosiers, regardless of where they live. State agencies are partnering with community organizations to ensure the homeless population has safe shelter.

Can I visit friends and family?

For your safety, as well as the safety of all Hoosiers, you should remain at home to help fight the spread of COVID-19. You may visit family members who need medical or other essential assistance, such as ensuring an adequate food supply.

Can I walk my dog or go to the veterinarian?

You are allowed to walk your dog and seek medical care for your pet should they require it. Practice social distancing while out on walks, maintaining at least 6 feet from other neighbors and their pets.

Can I take my kids to the park?

State parks remain open, but welcome centers, inns, and other buildings are closed. Families will be able to go outside and take a walk, run or bike ride, but they should continue to practice social distancing by remaining 6 feet away from other people. Playgrounds are closed because they pose a high risk of increasing spreading the virus.

Can I attend a religious service?

Large gatherings, including church services, will be canceled to slow the spread of COVID-19. Religious leaders are encouraged to continue livestreaming services while practicing social distancing with one another.

Can I leave my home to exercise?

Outdoor exercise such as running or taking a walk is acceptable. However, gyms, fitness centers and associated facilities will be closed to reduce the spread of the coronavirus. While exercising outside, you still should practice social distancing by running or walking at least 6 feet away from other people.

Can I go to the hair salon, spa, nail salon, tattoo parlor or barber shop?

No, these businesses are ordered closed.

Can I leave my home to do laundry?

Yes, laundromats, dry cleaners and laundry service providers are considered essential businesses.

Can I take my child to daycare?

Yes, daycares are considered an essential business.

Can I pick up meals at my child's school?

Yes, schools that provide free food services to students will continue on a pickup and take-home basis.

Primary election moved to June 2

Gov. Eric Holcomb joined Secretary of State Connie Lawson, Republican Party Chair Kyle Hupfer and Democratic Party Chair John Zody to announce an agreement to move the date of this year's Indiana primary election from May 5 to June 2.

All dates corresponding with the primary election will be moved by 28 days to reflect the new date of the primary. For example, military and overseas ballots are required to be mailed 45 days prior to the primary election, so they'll move 45 days prior to June 2. "The right of citizens to elect their leaders in a free and open election is one of the cornerstones of America. In order to balance that right with the safety of county employees, poll workers and voters, delaying Indiana's primary election is the right move as we continue to do all we can to protect Hoosiers' health," Holcomb said.

HERE'S WHAT YOU MISSED in this week's PULASKI COUNTY JOURNAL **Pulaski County courts respond to COVID-19**

In response to concerns about COVID-19, the Pulaski County courts are working with local emergency management, are monitoring the situation with guidance from health officials, remain open for operations, and are enacting continuity of operations, which will change how we operate. For questions about a specific hearing, you should contact that court directly.

The Indiana State Department of Health, which is Indiana's lead agency on COVID-19, has the latest information about the virus. The best approach is to use fundamental healthy practices, such as washing your hands, covering your mouth with your arm or a tissue rather than your hand, and staying home when you are ill.

Maintaining required court operations is important. The health and safety of our employees and community are equally important. Therefore, Pulaski County courts will operate using their developed continuity of operations plans and will continue to keep the community informed regarding procedures.

In Pulaski County, the Pulaski County Commissioners closed county buildings to the public, effective Monday, March 23. Court offices will remain open for telephone calls and e-filing, but the public will not be admitted unless directly ordered to do so.

Jury duty

Individuals who have received a jury summons should contact the court by telephone directly for instruction. No jury trials will occur in Pulaski County until after May 4, based upon the authority of the Indiana Supreme Court the order granted under Administrative Rule 17.

Litigants/parties to a case

Individuals who are scheduled to come to court for a hearing in a criminal matter or problem-solving court matter prior to April 6, should contact their attorney directly if they have not received notice in the mail specifically regarding that hearing. This is a constantly evolving situation and you should know the judges are watching it closely.

Individuals who are scheduled to appear for a juvenile or Child in Need of Services (CHINS) matter before April 17, should contact their attorney or circuit court if they are unrepresented, before any scheduled court date.

Individuals who are scheduled to appear in court for a civil matter prior to April 6 should contact their attorney directly by telephone.

If represented, litigants should be in contact with their attorney to receive the advice of counsel.

If you have been exposed to the COVID 19 virus, are not healthy, or need special consideration contact your attorney or the court by phone as soon as possible and prior to your scheduled hearing date. The court will attempt to make arrangements for you to appear by phone or electronically, if appropriate.

Attorneys

Lawyers who are scheduled to appear prior to April 6, should follow the guidelines provided them directly by the courts in previous communications. Any questions should be directed to the courts by telephone.

E-filing and Odyssey I

Pulaski County transitioned to the statewide case management system, Odyssey, on Monday, March 16, after a year of preparing to do so. This transition will allow the courts to continue to operate, even if staff must work remotely to handle filings. Cases and documents can continue to be filed through the statewide system. No filings will be accepted in person and should be mailed if an unrepresented litigant finds it necessary to do so. Please call the courts directly with questions regarding the same.

Litigants, attorneys, press and public can continue to view case information on mycase.in.gov.

Jail

The Pulaski County courts are working with the Pulaski County Sheriff to ensure public safety. Anyone arrested or defendants already in jail will continue to be seen by each judicial officer as required under existing laws. The courts will maintain each individual's right to due process, even considering these difficult times. Each court has established video conferencing ability with the jail to hold essential hearings as necessary for any inmate.

All questions regarding jail operations and visitation should be directed to the Pulaski County Sheriff's office at 574-946-6655.

Juvenile facility

Pulaski County does not have a juvenile facility. Each juvenile facility will have their own requirements. Please contact your child's probation officer if you do not have contact information for that facility. Please call a facility before you travel.

Pulaski Circuit Court will make necessary arrangements for counsel to meet with clients if necessary.

Probation and Court Ordered Services

Pulaski County courts run the Pulaski County probation department/court ordered services. All individuals on probation should continue to be in contact with their probation officer and are expected to continue to appear in person or as directed by their probation officer. Call the probation department at 574-946-6558 or email probationoffice@pulaskicounty.in.gov.

Special volunteers

Volunteers, such as CASA or VASIA, who have cases before the court scheduled through April 17, should contact Pulaski Circuit Court at 574-946-3851 for updates as to whether each hearing will be held or continued. If you have been exposed to the COVID 19 virus, are not healthy, or need special consideration, please contact the court by phone as soon as possible and prior to your scheduled hearing date. The court will attempt to make arrangements for you to appear by phone or electronically.

Administrative Rule 17

Administrative Rule 17 describes the Indiana Supreme Court's ability to oversee the local administration of trial courts in the event of any unanticipated work interruption. Trial courts can utilize the rule by petitioning the Supreme Court for emergency relief, if needed, based on local circumstances. Pulaski County Superior and Circuit Courts have filed a petition for emergency relief and it has been granted under 20S-CB-00160. A copy of the order is available upon request from either court or online.

The Pulaski County courts are working with local emergency management and health departments to ensure we are taking the necessary steps in response to the virus, while maintaining community safety. Media with questions should be directed to the judicial officer with any questions.

- No items will be due and no fines will be charged while the library is closed. Items are not expected to be returned before May 3, but can be returned in the front and back book drops. Remember to use the audiovisual drop for things like DVDs and CDs.

HERE'S WHAT YOU MISSED in this week's PULASKI COUNTY JOURNAL On My Way Pre-K applications for the 2020-2021 school year now available

Indiana's Office of Early Childhood and Out-of-School Learning is now accepting applications from families in any Indiana county who may be eligible for grants for their children to receive high-quality, prekindergarten education through the On My Way Pre-K program for the 2020-2021 school year. The program, which started as a five-county pilot and then expanded to 20 counties in 2017, became statewide in 2019.

In addition, OECOSL is introducing a new, easier-to-use online application called "Early Ed Connect," which families will use to apply for both On My Way Pre-K and child care assistance provided in Indiana via the federal Child Care Development Fund or "CCDF." Early Ed Connect offers the benefits of:

- Easy use via mobile devices, as well as on a computer or tablet
- Ability to apply for multiple children in one application
- Ability to upload supporting documents, including via photo from a mobile phone
- Ability to save application progress and complete it at a later time
- Notification of successful submission
- Spanish version is available

For the 2020-2021 school year, a child is eligible for an On My Way Pre-K voucher if they live in any Indiana county, will be 4 years old by Aug. 1, 2020, and plan to start kindergarten in the 2021-2022 school year. An eligible child must live in a household with income below 127% of the federal poverty level, and have parents or guardians who are working, going to school or attending job training.

There will also be a limited number of vouchers

available for a child who will be 4 years old by Aug. 1, 2020, lives in a household with income up to 185% of the federal poverty level and has:

- A parent/guardian who is working, attending job training or an educational program OR
- A parent/guardian who receives Social Security Disability Insurance or Supplemental Security Income benefits



On My Way Pre-K awards grants to 4-year-old children from low-income families so that they may have access to a high-quality pre-K program the year before they begin kindergarten. Families who receive a grant may use the grant at any approved On My Way Pre-K program throughout the state.

Once the family has met eligibility requirements and has been awarded a grant for their child, they may choose

from any of the eligible, enrolled On My Way Pre-K programs. Families can search approved providers at www. ChildCareFinder.IN.gov. Locally, Marsha's Family Child Care is a Level 3 Paths to Quality Child Care.

Approved pre-K programs may be located in a public or private school, licensed child care center, licensed home or registered ministry as long as that program meets the

quality requirements and is registered as an On My Way Pre-K Provider. Families may choose from a program that is full-day or part-day, as well as from programs that end with the school year or continue through the summer. Families who need help finding an approved pre-K program can also call 800-299-1627 for assistance from an early learning referral specialist.

More than 11,500 Hoosier children have attended preschool through a grant from the On My Way Pre-K program since it began in 2015. OECOSL continues to partner with Purdue University on a longitudinal study of children who have participated in the program in an attempt to measure their success. OECOSL also updates the Indiana General Assembly every year on the program. The most recent report can be found here.
