





The 50 ramps will be built in July and August by

adheres strictly to ADA standards. To qualify for the ramp build, recipients must have a long-term disability and have a household income below the Area Mean Income for the state of residence.

BraunAbility was founded in 1972 as The Braun Corporation in Winamac, Indiana by Ralph Braun, a wheelchair user himself who had muscular dystrophy. The company's manufacturing headquarters remains

Winamac, while the global headquarters is in Carmel. Today BraunAbility has over 1,400 employees and serves customers in more than 70 countries with a variety of mobility solutions.

Initiatives like the ramp builds are just one way BraunAbility employees serve as champions in their local communities in support of Braun Ability's Drive for Inclusion program, a united movement for greater accessibility and independence for those living with mobility challenges and their caregivers.





Helping street children is my passion and I not only reach out in the local community but have taken Rian (age 8) and Kipsang (age 13) into my care with guardianship of each of them. Before moving in with me, neither boy was previously enrolled in school. Both are now reading and learning mathematics - Rian at preschool level and Kipsang at a first grade level. With additional

tutoring and love, they are on a plan to eventually catch them up to their appropriate grade levels.

Basic shelter and food is a constant need for every family living in Kibera. Rian and Kipsang now have regular meals including meat. They safe living

environments and have created a bond as brothers. They are teaching me Swahili and I am teaching them English.
