Looking Back...

2012 - 10 years ago

The Indiana Academic Spell Bowl team at Winamac Community High School ended a highly successful season on Saturday. On that day, the team competed at the state finals at Purdue University in West Lafayette. The team placed sixth in the state in Class 3. This is the first state finalist team from Winamac since 2002.

1997 - 25 years ago

- Doug Gutwein from Francesville said that they have received a "Build Indiana" grant, and asked if the county was still interested in housing the ambulance in the new fire station after completion. The cost to the county would be approximately \$1,200 per month, which includes utilities. Gutwein explained that if Head Start also uses the facility, the county's cost would be lower. The Board explained that the County Council would have to help make the decision as they need to approve the funds for payment. The hospital must also be in agreement to sign the contract for housing.
- Winamac student Mike Haschel participated in the USA Junior Olympics cross country championship in Indianapolis. Haschel placed third overall out of over 50 top-quality runners in his age group. He finished with the time of 14:47 which qualifies him for the Regional Championship in Lisle, Illinois.

1972 - 50 years ago

- John Vessley and the Rev. Josef Palat received the Boy Scouts Award of Merit at the Northern District recognition dinner at Pinhook Grange last Tuesday night.
- Christmas decorations were put up the latter part of last week and this week by employees of the Town Light Department, Ken McFarland, a light department employee, displayed his artistic talent while decorating the poles.
- A two-ton truck driven by Raymond F. Rausch, 21, Winamac, sustained \$400 damages Friday evening on CR 100S, two and a half miles southwest of Winamac.
- Members of the Thomas Kaminski family, constructed a snowman during the snowfall Sunday evening.
- The Eastern Pulaski Community School Corporation Board is to review the maintenance program for the elementary school buildings at its meeting Monday at 8 p.m. in the office of Harry Cords, superintendent.
- A community Thanksgiving worship service will be held in the First Christian Church sanctuary. The Rev. Hal Thomas, pastor of the Winamac United Presbyterian Church will speak to the theme "An Appropriate Response."
- Approximately 225 people attended the Athletic Boosters club banquet last Wednesday night at the Winamac Community High School cafeteria and socialtorium for participating in fall sports were recognized.

1947 - 75 years ago

- Plans for holiday decorations in the business section of Winamac were practically agreed upon at a special meeting of the Chamber of Commerce. Final details are to be worked by a committee headed by Fred Russell and Ralph Miller.
- Mrs. Mary A. Crissinger, the community's oldest resident, passed away early this morning at the home of a daughter, Mrs. William Hall of Winamac, where she had been seriously ill for several weeks. She was ninety-six years old.
- Miss Shirley Halleck, sophomore at Indiana university, has been honored at the annual Recognition Tea given by Mortar Board, senior women's honorary society. Miss Halleck is the daughter of Dr. and Mrs. H. J. Halleck of Winamac.
- •Miss Carol Sue Carter of Kewanna became the bride of James B. Heater, Star City, in a formal ceremony performed Monday morning at St. Ann's rectory in Kewanna. The Rev. Fr. Holland read the double ring rites in the presence of the immediate families.
- The street crossing over the Pennsylvania tracks alongside the Phillips elevator at Star City was the scene Monday noon of a train-truck collision that caused the instant death of two men and injury of a third, all of Logansport.


1922 - 100 years ago

- The death of Marion Ludwig occurred Friday noon at the home of his parents, Mr. and Mrs. Henry Ludwig of Tippecanoe township, from obstruction of the bowels. He took sick at school on the preceding Tuesday. His age was fifteen years, five months and fifteen days.
- Automobile license plates for the year 1923 will be issued to car owners in Winamac. They are to be put "on sale" Dec. 12 according to present instruction. A supply of 1,700 plates has been shipped to Winamac, ready for distribution. 


